# ANNUAL REPORT *of the* President

*The 2008-2009 school year was a very good one with an enrollment in the fall of 236, down a modest two students from the prior year. While our long-range plan caps enrollment at 250, we can operate successfully anywhere in the 235-250 range. The key is reaching the budgeted tuition revenue, giving us the funds we need to run the school. We opened the 2009-2010 school year with 222 students and tuition revenue far below our goal. This necessitated revising our operating plan, a demanding task that we have accomplished.*

*The following report summarizes 2008-2009, a year of many achievements in academics, fine arts, and athletics. I hope you will find enjoyment in reading about the year and the fine faculty, staff, and students we have at Wayland.*

## NEW FACULTY

Once again we had limited turnover in our faculty.

Adam C. Yankay joined the faculty as an instructor in math and math department chair. Adam graduated Summa Cum Laude and received his B.A. in Art and Performance from the University of Texas at Dallas in 1997. He received an M.A.T. from University of Texas at Dallas in 2004 specializing in mathematics. He was a math teacher at The Highlands School in Dallas from 1998 through 2005. From 2005 to the present, Adam had been the math department chair at Vermont Academy. While teaching in Texas, Adam served as a curriculum writer for National Consultants for Education. He developed curricula for pre-algebra through algebra 2, including course summaries, benchmarks, scope and sequence, and lesson plans. Adam is very familiar with our new math sequence (Algebra 1, Algebra 2, and Geometry), and, before arriving in Beaver Dam, he worked closely with the department on this year's courses. Adam and his wife, Cara, have three children and are living in Glen Dye Residence Hall where Cara is the head resident.

Luke D. Houdek joined the faculty as director of the coordinated tutorial

program. Luke has an Associate of Arts and Sciences degree from UW Fond du Lac. He received a B.A. from Trinity Christian College in Illinois in 2006. His major areas of study were history and social studies. Luke served as a substitute teacher for two years at Central Waupun Christian Schools. For the last three years, he has taught history and coached at Heritage Christian Schools in Milwaukee. He has extensive coaching experience in basketball and football and has worked at the Milwaukee Bucks' Basketball Camps. In addition to his faculty responsibilities, Luke will work in the dorms and coach football and basketball. Luke and his wife, Julia, will be living on Franklin Street.

## ACADEMICS

Commencement week activities for the Class of 2009 began with our annual Honors Convocation and ended with Commencement Ceremonies on May 24. We were honored to have Governor Jim Doyle as our speaker. The Doyles are also parents of a Wayland alumnus. Their son, Gabe, graduated in 1997. Following commencement, the faculty held its annual retreat on campus. The faculty spent quite a bit of time reviewing the year and then moved to new topics. After a spirited conversation about final exams and

how we assess student work in classes, we agreed to modify the traditional end-of-semester testing to allow for a variety of assessment methods. For example, English and history teachers may opt to replace their final exam with a final research paper due on the last day of the semester. We will continue to evaluate our end-of-semester activities to ensure that we are meeting the needs of our students.

I am pleased to report that two faculty members have completed advanced degrees. Sean Costello in the English department and PJ Osvald from the history department have successfully completed master's degrees. Two faculty members continue to pursue advanced degrees. Jason Nicholson continues to work on his Ph.D. in philosophy, and Tyler Graham will be finishing a degree in pastoral theology in the coming year.

We were notified at the end of August that one senior student has been named as a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist for 2010. On the basis of his performance on the 2008 PSAT test, Nicholas Derr will continue in the competition for scholarships.

## ACADEMY LIFE

The 2008-2009 school year was a productive one in terms of residential living. Our greatest success was the group of 52 seniors who graduated in May. Of these students, 33 were four-year seniors, the largest such group that Wayland had seen in many years. Most of their stories carried two common themes: consistent improvement through the years and a deep loyalty to the Academy. It was a tear-filled commencement ceremony, and I imagine that we will see many of them making detours to Beaver Dam in the coming months and years.

There were many of notable events on campus over the last year. Among them was a well-received chapel talk from one of the few Holocaust survivors. The senior class continued to run Heaton's Union with little outside help from the faculty and staff. I was also impressed with the success of a number of the student-run clubs. The most prominent startups were an Ultimate Frisbee club (that had a number of events held at night with glow-in-the-dark Frisbees), a group that monitored human rights, and a club for food enthusiasts that met over lunch on Fridays. We were also blessed with a

great group of student leaders spread throughout the classes. I am certain this was the main reason that the need for student discipline was at an all-time low.

The class of 2010 expects to have a great year. It is our largest class in a number of years, and their members have high aspirations for their year as the leaders of the pack. I would encourage alumni to visit campus and witness what I believe is Wayland's greatest asset: our diverse, motivated, and caring student body.

## ADMISSION

The economy presented challenges to the admission process this past year, yet Wayland was still able to attract 222 students to campus. In addition, we were able to draw more Midwest Talent Search (MTS) students than in years past. Just three years ago, we had three MTS students on campus. Now, Wayland has 14 MTS students. They are youth who have tested in the 85th percentile or better in the primary academic categories we use to evaluate prospective students.

Retention was again above 80%. This is a clear sign that the school is meeting our students' academic and social needs and fulfilling our mission of preparing students for college. In addition, with the newly renovated Wayland Hall, the admission office has one more outstanding facility to show prospective families.

Eric Peters, dean of admission and college counseling, has returned his entire staff for the fifth straight year. This consistency has helped Wayland attract more students to look at Wayland than in years past.

## COLLEGE COUNSELING

Wayland's mission, in part, is to "prepare students for a successful college experience."

Once again, our graduates were successful in finding schools that were the right fit for them. Our faculty has done a great job preparing our students for college, allowing them to gain admission to some of the top schools in the country. Schools that admitted our students included Stanford University, University of Richmond, Brown University, Northwestern University, Georgia Tech University's School of Engineering, Washington University in St. Louis, University of Chicago, University of Wisconsin - Madison, Denison University, Wheaton College, Auburn University, Smith College, Tulane University, Connecticut College, Rice University, Macalester College, Lawrence University, New York University, Marquette University, DePaul University, and Syracuse University.

## ATHLETICS

Over the course of the year our athletic teams continued to be strong competition for all who faced the "Big Red." Several teams made school history and some individuals advanced to sectional and state competitions.

### *Fall Sports*

In the fall, our football team finished regular season play with an 8-1 record. For the second year in a row, they qualified for the state playoffs and gave their playoff opponent one of the hardest hitting games they had played all year. Several players made first-team all-conference: seniors Joe Richardson, Steve McCaskill, Austin Williams, Brennan Fitzgerald, Adam Bunkoske, Tyler Hill, and junior Nick Schubert. The field hockey, cross country, and girls' tennis teams had strong performances both on the JV and varsity levels. Boys' soccer finished the season at .500, having played several strong state caliber level teams. Girls' volleyball won their conference tournament, but they took second place in the conference for the season. The team finished with a 22-7 record and was the first Wayland volleyball team to host and win a WIAA regional contest. The squad had two first-team all-conference players in juniors Megan Connell and Jenna Ptaschinski. The

team returns all but one member from last year's successful squad. With so much returning talent and leadership, new coach Judy Hill and her team should have a great season.

### *Winter Sports*

The winter season brought some history-making moments as well. The girls' basketball team was the first Wayland girls' basketball squad to host and win their first round WIAA regional game. The girls also made Wayland history with an overall record of 16-5, scoring 998 points on the season. Sophomore Anne Rauschert was selected first-team all-conference, and junior Bri Medley was selected as this year's Midwest Classic Conference division player of the year. Both the swim team and the ski team competed well on the varsity and JV levels. The JV swim team has been undefeated in dual meets for the last few years. The boys' basketball team continued to compete on three different levels: varsity, JV Red, and JV White. The the varsity squad posted an 8-12 overall record, and senior Brennan Fitzgerald was named first-team all-conference. Organized cheerleading returned to the sidelines of Pickard Court, as the squads supported the JV and varsity boys' and girls' basketball teams and, along with the pep band, brought much enthusiasm to the Field House.

### *Spring Sports*

While two individuals advanced to the state tournaments in their respective spring sports, all of the Wayland spring sports teams performed well and showed great sportsmanship and character throughout the season. The golf team had a strong season, getting some dual meet wins and finishing well in many of the conference meets. Freshman Michael Vaubel led the team and advanced to the state tournament. Baseball finished the season 6-8 in conference play. The team surprised Brookfield Academy in the first round of regional play with a 4-1 upset, having lost twice to Brookfield in regular season games. Senior Brennan Fitzgerald was selected first-team all-conference. The girls' soccer team completed their season with a 6-10 overall record, as seniors Kelsey Peters and Lindsay Cieslik and juniors Stephanie Hill and Laura Bachman all received first-team all-conference honors. The girls' softball team had another strong season with an 11-4 overall record while finishing second in conference play. Juniors Megan Connell and Johanna Sckaer and sophomore Amanda Tramm were named first-team all-conference. Boys' tennis

went 5-4 overall with the number one doubles team of Zach Schubert and Michael Estrella advancing to sectional play. The boys' track team had a nice season, winning two quad meets and grabbing two new school records. Josiah Hintz, Shane Preston, Damarr Purifoy, and Aaron Brown ran the 1600-meter relay in 3:34.19. Brendan Weinstein, Josiah Hintz, Shane Preston, and Tyler Hill set a new 3200-meter relay school record with a time of 8:47.68. The girls' track team also had a strong season with two new school records and a state track meet participant. Anne Rauschert set a new 400-meter dash record in a time of 1:03.94 and a new high jump record at 5' 4". Anne also advanced to the state meet in the high jump, grabbing a 6th place state finish for the second year in a row.

And while the teams were competing and working hard, the individual team

members continued to garner the Champion of Character end of season award. This award is given to that player who best displays Wayland's core values of gratitude, respect, integrity, passion, and caring. Many feel this is the sports award of highest value, as it is given to those who may not have the most skill but have the desire to play the game for its intrinsic value.

## DEVELOPMENT

The Wayland Hall renovation project has been completed and the final product exceeds our expectations. The fundraising campaign, however, continues, as we still need to raise nearly \$1 million of the \$4 million goal. Annual giving to The Academy Fund was excellent, as we exceeded our goal of \$550,000 and obtained a 20 percent alumni participation rate, a level that was previously reached

only during the Sesquicentennial year. The Academy Fund provides critical revenue to operations, allowing the administration to attract top students and faculty and to complete necessary repairs and small remodeling projects on campus. Tuition dollars provide only a portion of our revenue needs. Trent Jackson, in his third year as vice president of development, leads the development operations.

Under the guidance of Alumni Director Stephanie Franklin, the Alumni Board completed a successful year with Michael VanHaren '82 as president. We continued the fun alumni event, "Wayland After Work," with gatherings in Phoenix, Denver, and Madison. A good time was always had by all! This year's big event was the Wayland Hall Rededication on October 17, 2009.



## FINANCE

Fiscal year 2009 revenues were \$5,952,519. While tuition revenue was a bit short of our target, we exceeded our revised *Academy Fund* goal by \$24,035 for a total of \$574,035. We managed to hold expenses to \$5,870,554, thereby generating a surplus of \$81,965. This expense control was just an introduction to what we must do in fiscal 2010, as the weak economy has descended upon us in full force.

The Wayland Hall pledges remain strong, and donors continue to make gifts to the project. With construction costs of \$4,075,544, maintaining this successful fundraising campaign has become crucial.

We recently decided to outsource the management of our Information Technology (IT) department to Inter-Quest, a locally owned technology company. With this change, we will have more depth of expertise in many IT areas since numerous Inter-Quest employees have continued their education and obtained certification in many specialty technologies. Remote Desktop Services (RDS) is among the many new technologies Inter-Quest is installing at Wayland. This will eliminate the need to install

software, such as Microsoft Office, directly on to each employee's laptop or desktop computer. The use of this virtualization technology will also allow us to reduce the number of actual servers from eleven to one. This will vastly reduce the power consumption making the addition of any new virtual computer extremely cost effective.

Current projects include upgrading the school's wireless network for better speed and security, integrating the data in two databases, connecting the Field House to the Wayland infrastructure, and installing new Web filtering software for improved Internet safety for students and remote access for employees.

## CONCLUSION

2008-2009 was a satisfying year on most counts. It certainly did not presage the negative impact of the disastrous economy, the impact of which I wrote about in my letter to alums, parents, and friends on July 30, 2009, which outlined the need to continue supporting the Wayland Hall project. You are responding well, as we press on with our fundraising activities, and we are grateful.

As for our challenges in the face of lower enrollment and tuition dollars, our revised budget will meet this test, and we expect to generate a modest surplus.

I leave you with a quote from Trustee Emeritus Judy Pickard Yeakel, whose family has lived through much of Wayland's history. At a trustee meeting during a difficult time in the early 1990s she said in a modest and straightforward tone, "Wayland has survived tough times before, and we will again."

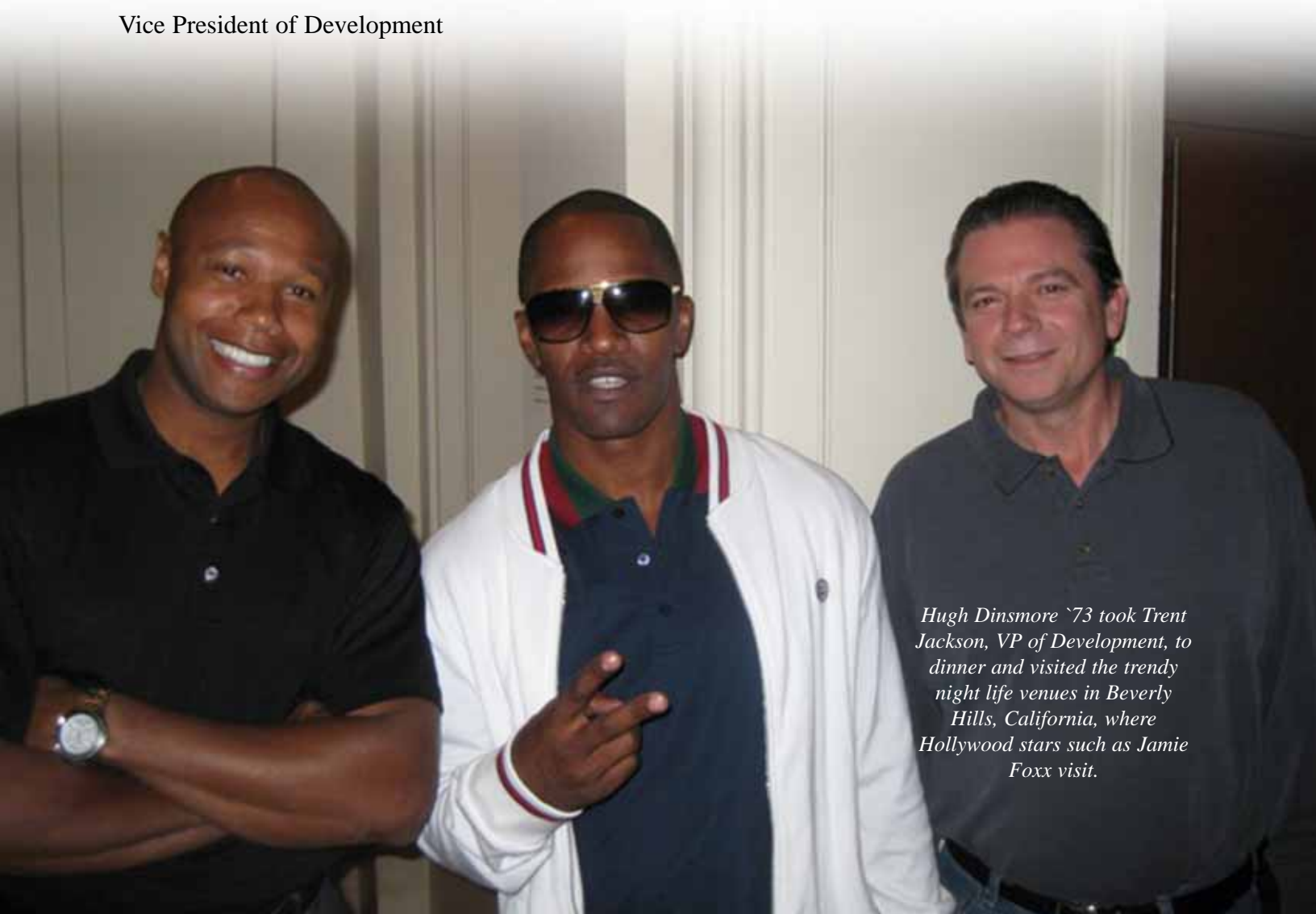
# DONOR RECOGNITION

# Mark Rauschert `83

## Making his Mark: Rauscherts Forever

Mark Rauschert's Wayland story is not merely life-long; it is trans-generational. With a father as a longtime member of the Board of Trustees, siblings, and children graduating, attending, or about to attend Wayland, his life at the Academy is now an experience that takes on a meta-personal level. Nevertheless, his own story is still worth telling.

Mark recalls that his first trip to Wayland was to see his older brother, Phil Rauschert `76, perform in the Academy's production of "Camelot." He made subsequent trips, which ultimately included his sister, Laura Rauschert Millar `80, as well. Mark remembers, "All three of us were raised with the stories we heard from our father, Karl `47, and a few of his classmates (i.e., Bill Heaton and Judy Pickard) with whom he had kept in contact."

From his own experience at Wayland, Mark is ever-enamored with its "totally encompassing" quality. The fact that the faculty are in the classroom, dorm, and on the field with the students essentially 24/7 strikes him as its greatest asset.

Importantly, though, it was neither the profound Wayland family experience nor his own life at the Academy that moved him to the active life of donor (on an annual basis). Mark explains that, "While my parents had always encouraged me to give money to Wayland, it wasn't until I became a trustee that I fully realized that the actual financial cost to Wayland far exceeded the tuition. The shortfall between what parents were paying and what it was costing the Academy to educate the students was, perhaps, \$10,000 per student in the late 1990s. At that time, that meant that one third of each student's Wayland experience and education was being funded by alumni who in many cases didn't even know that student. That was a powerful testimony to what Wayland means to many of its alumni. I, in turn, recognized how invaluable my Wayland experience had been and wanted to contribute as best I could. In some years, that meant donating money. In other years, it meant acting as an unofficial ambassador for the Academy, recruiting prospective students."

Mark continues to hold out for a vision of Wayland that is world class with affordable tuition and one that holds true to its motto promoting authentic character. He maintains, "Wayland is a small enough environment that character can become a curriculum, not just a slogan."

To all who want to help the Academy, Mark has these words for you: "Wayland needs your financial resources, your testimony, and your referrals. If you are financially blessed, share that with Wayland. If giving to Wayland does not fit into your family's plans, you can still tell your Wayland story, and, just as importantly, you can tell potential parents and students about Wayland. If you encourage someone to go to Wayland, that gift to the school is far more important than whether or not you have contributed financially. Don't limit how you can support the Academy by narrowly thinking of only whether or not you can make a financial contribution.

And the next time you visit Wayland, make sure you make a lay-up on the brand new wood floor named "Rauschert Family Court," the latest renovation to Lindsay Gymnasium.

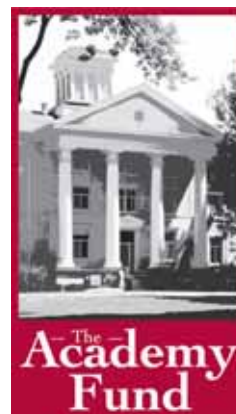

## Fred Bishop `57

*“There is no greater gift a parent can give to a student than a Wayland education.”*

Fred Bishop `57 was raised by a mother from a small Iowa farm and an orphaned Swiss father. Their greatest desire was to see their son get a good education and go to college. As Fred’s intellectual talents emerged in middle school, a friend told his father that Fred’s attendance at the local high school would mean he’d make a good mechanic some day. The family began to look elsewhere. Eventually, Fred attended Todd School for Boys in Woodstock, Illinois. The school collapsed, however, at the end of his freshman year.

On the recommendation of Betsy Roberts `49, Fred headed off to Wayland his sophomore year, joining the class of 1957. Of his time at Wayland, Fred recalls fondly the “outstanding teachers,” in particular Leo Schnur, David Proctor, Martin Meyer, J. Hobart Tucker, and A.E. Wichman. According to Fred, “they were a family who took me under their wing.”

The Wayland education proved valuable to Fred, and he found himself at Princeton University upon graduation in 1957. To this day, it is the voice of President Ray Patterson that sticks with him. As Fred neared graduation, Patterson warned him, “You may be near the top of your class at Wayland, but at Princeton, you’ll have to work your fanny off.” According to Bishop, Radar Ray was right.

Fred graduated from Princeton with an AB in 1961 and went on to attend Northwestern University School of Law, where he earned his JD in 1966. In retrospect, Fred says that he treasures his Wayland experience more highly than either his time at Princeton or Northwestern.

Fred worked for the Harris Bank until he retired as a Vice President of Corporate Financial Services in early 1979. He and his wife Stephanie then formed a consulting company, Bishop Consulting Services. As a consultant, Fred has specialized in the capital structures of small, privately-held companies. Fred has three grown daughters, two teachers and a social worker. To his children, Fred emphasized the importance of making a difference in the lives of others. As a result, all three girls have committed their time to expanding access to education. Recently, Wayland elected his daughter, Hilary Bishop Scott, to their board of trustees.

Fred has contributed to Wayland every year since his graduation in 1957. For Fred, it is the high quality of a Wayland education that makes donating to the school so compelling. His philanthropy, he says, involves making a Wayland education available to those students who otherwise could not afford to be there. His gifts have gone to scholarships, the Wayland Hall renovation, The Academy Fund, and Franklin Street faculty housing.

In addition, Fred has been an active trustee since 1972. As a trustee, his involvement largely has centered on investment and endowment management. In recent years, Fred also has concentrated on fundraising and developing The 1855 Society.

Fred’s consistent vision is that Wayland be the top college prep school in the Midwest. He states, “I believe a Wayland education to be the best among the many fine co-educational day and boarding schools in the Midwest.”

## Greg Pusinelli: The Difference a School Can Make

Although relatively new to the Wayland family, Greg Pusinelli is not new to the world of gift-giving for small independent schools. Having supported Providence St. Mel's school in Chicago for many years, Greg knows the multiple difficulties faced by such institutions. But he also knows how profoundly important they are. In his own words, we must be so "aware of the difference that a school can make on someone's life . . . that everything else seems to pale in comparison."

Greg came in contact with Wayland when his son Adam began to have difficulties with the choices many of his friends were making at the large public school of Hinsdale Central. Looking around, they found that Wayland had a good reputation for Hinsdale students transferring there, so they went with it. At the time, Greg's only other connection with the Academy was the fact that his cousin Carol had gone to Wayland as a senior in 1977.

Did the "gamble" pay off? Pusinelli said, "It has been all that we hoped for; I told Trent [Jackson] that, obviously, the school is not inexpensive, but, for us to make the Wayland Hall contribution shows how satisfied and excited and grateful we were about it."

In fact, Greg has also become a major "Chicago area" spokesman for Wayland, talking it up in multiple conversations with peers whose children are looking for the most out of their high school experience.

As Greg reflects on the success that his son had at Wayland and the positive aspects that the Academy brings in general, he notes that the small class size and the constant faculty-to-student contact make it what it is. He was always impressed during parent-teacher conferences that Adam's instructors were able to "talk chapter and verse" with him about his son.

Perhaps, though, the distinguishing factor in a Wayland private education (that sets it apart from many other Midwest private schools) is the international presence that the boarding school provides. Greg was very impressed by how the school really does characterize the ideal of "diversity." Adam's strong friendship with Sang-Yoon Cha from Korea is a sign of the reality of that international presence on campus.

Greg lives with his wife and four children in the Chicago area, and he works as a portfolio manager for William Blair and Co. As he looks to the future for private education, and Wayland in particular, he hopes to see schools be able to do educationally what they need to do without always consulting the budget. He offers the following advice to anyone considering a donation to the Academy: "It is the best investment you can make."

## A New World of Opportunities

Mrs. Barbara Burstein Katz `51 came to Wayland as a very young 13-year-old and left transformed by an experience that gave her “a superb education with excellent teachers, lifelong friendships, the self-confidence to achieve heights that I had never even dreamed of, a well-rounded life in scholastics, music, sports, and a variety of extracurricular activities.”

Even though her brother had been attending Wayland by the time she began in 1947, she remembers “Wayland was a ‘world’ away from all that [she] had known.” Surprised by the abundance of opportunities offered by the school and its capacity to give her “more in that relatively short period of time than I could have ever imagined,” Barbara left Wayland as Valedictorian, Kit Mayer Sports Award winner, *Cum Laude Society* membership, Junior Marshall status, Editor of the Pillars, and award winner in sports, music, journalism, and forensics.

The success at the Academy was also the bedrock for the success she found after Wayland. “Without the benefits of the Wayland experience, I never would have been able to venture forth into the wider world of four years at the University of Michigan, followed by more years than I care to count in New York City (where I raised three children) and Connecticut, and a 25-year professional life at Barron’s Weekly/Dow Jones & Co.”

Barbara has been able to give back to Wayland in ways other than strictly financial ones. As she explains, “While there were many years during which I wish I could have been more generous financially, I tried to make up for that lack by giving of my time - organizing tri-state (New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut) get-togethers, serving as Wayland’s representative among many New England prep schools, being a class agent during the past 28 years, and serving as a member of the special Sesquicentennial Planning Committee. In addition, “I’ve continued to host area get-togethers in my home in the Tucson area during the past 10 years.”

Barbara to this day considers her dearest Wayland relationships as part of her family. She writes, “In recalling our memorable 50th Class Reunion in 2001, I will never forget those 30 hardy souls who braved a chilly, rainy weekend in Beaver Dam to lend me their support and friendship . . . not long after my beloved husband Steve had passed away.”

As she reflects on the life and future of the Academy, Barbara hopes that Wayland “will continue to do all that it does best for at least another century or more. And for someone contemplating a donation to Wayland, he/she could not make a better investment in the future of America’s youth.”

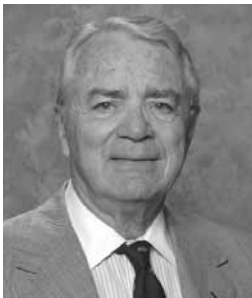
